## The Noojee Trestle Bridge Walk and Rail Trail

This iconic walk features the renowned No. 7 Noojee Trestle Bridge, a marvel of engineering and one of Victoria's few remaining historic timber trestle bridges, elevated high above the river. Enjoy a leisurely stroll along the rail trail, where you can immerse yourself in the tranquility of the surrounding forest. This 3 km return trail is generally flat and suitable for most fitness levels, allowing you to traverse tall trees and gain historical insights into the old timber railway line.





This historic walk is dedicated to Ralph Cornwall, a sawmill worker from Noojee who had a passion for the tramway. Enjoy a peaceful stroll along a 2.5 km section of an old timber tramway that was once used to transport logs out of the forest. Along the way, take time to admire the remnants of the tramway and the informative signs that provide context about the area. As you continue through the beautiful tall forests, you'll cross gullies covered with a thick layer of tall ferns. If you're fortunate, you might spot lyrebirds, parrots, and other local wildlife.

## The Water Wheel Walk

A scenic path leads to an impressive historic water wheel, nestled in lush vegetation and accompanied by the soothing sounds of nature. This spot is perfect for photography and relaxation. The water wheel is located in the river behind the Noojee Hotel. The walk is enjoyable as you stroll alongside the Latrobe River.



## The Toorongo Falls and Amphitheatre Falls Circuit Walk

The Toorongo Falls Reserve near Noojee features an easy 2.2 km loop trail that takes about 45 minutes to 1 hour to complete. This well-maintained gravel path leads to two stunning waterfalls: Toorongo Falls and Amphitheatre Falls. The trail winds through a picturesque tall mountain forest along the Toorongo and Little Toorongo Rivers.
