THE PLATFORM CONTAINER UPDATE

We have been working very hard to set up the container as an interpretive display with the following tasks completed in October:

- 1. Painting the interior, including the map cabinets, which will have new signs attached.
- 2. Cleaning the entire space especially the floor ready for new mats.
- 3. Fixing the soundproof brown display boards at the back of the container to prepare for the attachment of the local history images and memorabilia.
- 4. Testing motion sensor lighting to illuminate the maps and displays.
- 5. Repairing the platform floor to ensure safer access.

- 1. The stand, which was generously donated by DEECA, has been successfully hoisted and securely erected. It is now in preparation to be painted a black colour, which will create a uniform backdrop for the display of the \$500 sponsorship plaques that will honour our sponsors.
- 2. We are pleased to announce the completion of the fence extension along Mt. Baw Baw Tourist Road. This enhancement not only improves the visual appeal of the area but also increases safety and security. Additionally, a gate has been installed at the entrance of the walkway on School Road, ensuring that access to this pathway is secure and well-monitored.
- 3. The bike stand has received a complete makeover and has been moved from its previous location near the School Road entrance. It is now positioned in front of Heritage Gifts and Coffee, an ideal spot for bike riders. This new location not only makes it more convenient for cyclists to park their bikes while visiting the shop but also encourages more people to utilise the bike stand as they explore the area.



RALPH CORNWALL TAPES FROM NIECE JOY NIVEN

We have been extremely fortunate to receive a tape recorded by Ralph Cornwall about the Noojee Trestle Bridge Walk, which was recorded in early 1990. We are currently working on transforming this incredible find into a DVD presentation showcasing Ralph's extensive knowledge of Noojee and the surrounding region.

Background: Ralph dedicated many years to the search and rescue service, and his vast knowledge of the area proved invaluable.

Ralph Cornwall dreamed of transforming the Loch Valley Tramway into a walking trail that would benefit not only locals but also attract tourists. Unfortunately, he passed away on June 7, 1997, before this project could be completed. In his honor, the Tramway Walk has been named the Ralph Cornwall Loch Valley Tramway Walk.

RECOGNISING THE 'ANGEL OF NOOJEE' GLADYS SANDERSON EXHIBITION

The Noojee & District Historical Society Inc. are proud to present a permanent photographic display in the 1960 Louvre Van Carriage at the Noojee Heritage Railway Station Precinct. This display coincides with the dedication of the Noojee Reserve, which will be named after a local hero: The Gladys Sanderson Park, on 30 November 2025.

We are excited to celebrate her incredible contributions and the many lives she touched! Gladys Sanderson's selflessness and courage have left a lasting mark on the history of Noojee.

Gladys's extraordinary bravery was widely recognized, and her story made headlines from Warragul to London. In June 1940, she was awarded the Order of the British Empire for "gallantry and devotion to duty." The Order of the British Empire is a British order of chivalry founded in 1917 to recognise individuals for significant service to their country.
